What is a social enterprise?

- Social enterprises are **businesses** that work primarily to improve the lives of people. Their core objective is to achieve a social, societal, or environmental impact.
- pursue their objectives by **trading in goods and services**, on an ongoing basis.
- **surpluses generated are re-invested** into achieving their core social objectives.
- They frequently work to **support disadvantaged groups** such as the long-term unemployed, people with disabilities, the Traveller community, etc., or to address issues such as food poverty, social housing, or **environmental matters**.
